



Former Philadelphia Eagles Offensive Tackle Barrett Brooks Brought Inspiring Words to Atlantic City Public Schools for Red Ribbon Week

ATLANTIC CITY - Former Eagles Offensive Tackle Barrett Brooks brought inspiring messages to Atlantic City High School and various elementary schools, including Brighton Avenue School, Chelsea Heights School, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. School Complex, New York Avenue School, Richmond Avenue School, Sovereign Avenue School, and Texas Avenue School, in honor of Red Ribbon week.

The Atlantic City Public Schools joined the national antidrug campaign from October 23, 2024, to October 31, 2024. "Red Ribbon Week serves as a potent reminder of the importance of making healthy choices and staying committed to a drug-free life," said Superintendent of Schools Dr. La'Quetta S. Small. "Our district is committed to providing a safe and supportive environment where every student can thrive. Together, we can make a lasting impact and ensure that our students have the bright, drug-free futures they deserve."





Brooks, who played 12 years in the NFL, including a Super Bowl-winning stint with the Pittsburgh Steelers, visited the district to share insights on achieving success while avoiding the pitfalls of substance abuse. "I'm not here to preach to you," Brooks told students. "I'm here to put you up on game."

Speaking to high school seniors, on Thursday, October 31, 2024, Brooks offered hard-earned wisdom about financial management and planning, while also reflecting on challenges many professional athletes face after retirement. He also encouraged students to excel in whatever they pursue, sharing his personal journey of perseverance despite initial disinterest in football. "Whatever I do, I do it to the best of my ability," he said.

Uptown School Complex highlighted Red Ribbon Week with creative anti-drug initiatives, including themed days such as "crazy sock day" to "sock it to drugs" and wearing school gear to show unity. Other schools in the district, including Pennsylvania Avenue School and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. School Complex, held similar activities, including art contests and themed dress days.

The week's events culminated with Brooks' presentations, which inspired many students. Brooks emphasized the importance of education and diverse career paths.

Atlantic City Public Schools' staff, including Dr. Kelly Bird, Michele Farrell, and Theda Allen, praised the campaign for promoting prevention and awareness. "The most important thing is that students know they have someone they can trust," said Farrell. The district's focus on healthy choices aligns with the campaign's 2024 theme: "Film Your Future Drug-Free."



Atlantic City High School Competed for Central Jersey Group V Championship for First Time in 25 Years

ATLANTIC CITY - The Atlantic City High School Vikings Football team battled the Washington Township Minutemen on Friday, November 15, 2024. This marked the first time Atlantic City advanced that far in the playoffs since 1999.

The Atlantic City High School football team (8-3) lost to Washington Township 27-6. The Vikings final game will be played at Holy Spirit on Thanksgiving Day, November 28, 2024 at 10:00 a.m.
